# Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024

**Co-Option of a new Parish Councillor:** It was agreed to advertise the current vacancy with a view to co-opting at the  $3^{rd}$  July Parish Council meeting. This will bring the number of councillors back to the maximum of 13.

**Grants:** The Parish Council offers grants to organisations based in Bourton-on-the-Water, or those which provide a direct benefit to a significant sector of the local community. This year we have small grants available up to £1,000 and the deadline for applications is 20<sup>th</sup> August, for consideration at our September Parish Council meeting. Application forms are available on our website <a href="http://www.bourtononthewaterpc.org.uk/community/bourton-on-the-water-parish-council-7919/grants/">http://www.bourtononthewaterpc.org.uk/community/bourton-on-the-water-parish-council-7919/grants/</a> or please contact the Parish Clerk.

**Brighter Bourton event 11<sup>th</sup> July:** This event has been postponed until after the General Election. It is hoped to set another date for later in the summer.

**D-Day 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Event 6<sup>th</sup> June:** The lighting of the beacon at the Village Green was well attended. We would like to thank all those volunteers who helped set up the event, Hartwells for supplying a gas cylinder to light the beacon, Bourton Roadrunners for the post and chain barriers, and also to the residents who knitted poppies to decorate the High Bridge and the area around the war memorial.

#### County and District Councillor Updates:

**County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson** has taken over the Parking Portfolio at Cotswold District Council and has been working with the County and District Councils to continue to investigate options for coach pick-up and drop-off. The Robin on-demand bus service is now available in the South Cotswolds area.

**District Councillor Jon Wareing** reported on affordable housing challenges, with housing associations struggling with growing costs. Waste and recycling collections days would be changing for 60% of households from June 2024 with an aim to save £500k annually and improve climate efficiencies. Households would receive detailed communications about the changes.

**District Councillor Len Wilkins** reported that CDC had agreed to dispose of the former Visitor Information Centre in the village. A successful grant application will provide funds for installation of 66 electric vehicle chargers across 11 car parks to align with Climate Change objectives.

Residents were reminded that photo ID would be required at polling stations for the General Election on  $4^{th}$  July.

South West Ambulance Service Community Responders will be holding a session on defibrillator awareness and information on volunteer recruitment at 7.30pm on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> July in the Windrush Room, The George Moore Commu-

### **Bourton WI**

Only a few years ago dried flower arrangements were seen as old fashioned but, like those flared jeans you have in the back of the wardrobe, they



have now had a resurgence in popularity! Immortal, or everlasting flowers, as the Victorians called them, are a huge passion of June's WI guest speaker Christine.

We enjoyed watching a demonstration where Christine made dried flower arrangements and a hand tied bouquet at a fraction of the cost of buying them! By growing flowers from seeds, foraging for wild flowers, grasses and wheat, Christine dries flowers to make the most stunning baskets and bouquets. This is a relatively simple and cost effective hobby. Christine uses different methods to dry her flowers and did you know that it can be as simple as layering lavender in a shoe box or putting stems into a vase with a small amount of water and just letting them dry out!

Buying dried flowers from garden centres can be expensive so Christine uses flowers from her garden too. Flowers need to be picked in the middle of the day and quality can be weather dependent.

So get picking any bluebells, hyacinth and lavender you have as in no time, you can start creating beautiful dried flowers.

Dried flowers can also be spray painted (with a special floral paint) so you can make glorious arrangements for Christmas decorations.
