#### Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes



BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER Notes from the Parish Council Meeting 7<sup>th</sup> August 2024

**Coach Parking, pick-up and drop-off:** All attendees at the meeting were disappointed to note Gloucestershire County Council Highways' update

that none of the suggested options for coach pick-up or drop-off were considered viable. The proposed Bourton Link/Jubilee Lodge location was not supported by nearby businesses, and GCC currently have no plans to take forward the proposed TRO (Traffic Regulation Order) to extend the existing ban on coaches in the village centre and favour an off-street solution for pick-up/drop-off. Council noted that there are no suggested locations at present.

County Cllr Paul Hodgkinson is still awaiting a formal report from GCC Highways and noted the MP's survey results with the top choice being the use of the industrial estate. Cllr Hodgkinson is also awaiting a response from Bourton Business Network on suggestions including a vintage coach or train to provide transport for coach passengers into the village centre.

Cllr Hodgkinson, as Cotswold District Council's Cabinet Member for Health, Leisure and Parking has requested a report from CDC into the use of the Rissington Road car park. CDC have also been asked to explore any other possibilities to alleviate the lack of coach parking.

The Parish Council are contacting the Police and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner to highlight problems with coaches manoeuvring, obstructing and reversing into residential roads. In addition, the Traffic Regulation Order from 2012 which excludes PSV/PCVs from the centre of the village is being ignored. This TRO applies to buses, coaches and minibuses operating for hire and reward with more than 8 passenger seats but excludes local buses.

A statement has been made by the Bourton Business Network to coach operators advising them to make as safe a disembarkation point as feasibly possible. The Parish Council asked BBN to make it known that this advice has had no input from the Parish Council.

**Tourist Levy Funding 2024-25:** CDC advised that there is approximately £16,000 available for projects once annual project costs are considered. This is significantly less than in previous years, so CDC have taken the decision not to hold a public consultation. The Parish Council therefore chose to go ahead with the project to resurface and possibly block-pave the area in front of the two large triangular planters and parish noticeboard in the High Street. The full amount of £16,000 is being requested to cover the works and registration of the land.

**Installation of dropped kerbs:** Previously awarded Tourist Levy funds will be used for the installation of three dropped kerbs in the



#### **Message from the Church**

I wonder who else has been fascinated by Jason Manford and his rediscovery of all those hymns and songs he used to sing as part of school assembly?

Jason is now 43 so his primary school days would have been in the 1980s and early 1990s and the songs he has released include "He's Got the Whole World in his Hands", "This Little Light of Mine", "Shine Jesus Shine" and "Give me Oil in my Lamp." It made me think perhaps we should re- name one Sunday as "Assembly Sunday" and see what happens!

For all of us our childhood provides lasting memories. I hope for most of us (although I recognise that not for all) those memories are positive. Perhaps all of us do have an old favourite song or hymn which transports us back to a time when life was simpler and faith so much more straightforward.

St Paul talks about childhood in his first letter to the Corinthians:

When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a

child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. (1 Cor 13 vs 11). This by itself, sounds negative, that when one grows up and learns more about the world, childish things, perhaps like unquestioning acceptance of faith in school assembly, is dismissed – but no, because Paul goes on to say: For now we see in a mirror, dimly but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love. (1 Cor 13 vs 12 & 13).

So, I wonder how many of us have got to the point of putting aside a childish understanding of God, but have never actually taken the next step — which is of seriously considering faith as an adult and allowing God himself to show us the truth? Why not take a moment, pop down to the church, make use of the quiet and the beauty, and ask God to draw close.

Greystones Farm—Making History


Human impact at Greystones can be tracked back for thousands of years. Greystones was the site of the old Salmonsbury camp, an important meeting place during Neolithic and Iron Age periods and a Scheduled Monument today.

Now managed by Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust, Greystones is a haven for wildlife, as well as a working dairy farm. You may see otters and water voles in the Dikler and Eye as they pass through, or migratory birds such as swallows and house martins, along with owls and bats, in the older farm buildings.

Throughout the summer we have been opening the replica Iron Age roundhouse and the Discovery Centre to the general public between 11am and 3pm so that people can gain a greater understanding of the site, its history and the wonder of the natural world on site. To do so we have been reliant on our amazing local volunteers. Without them it would not be possible. It's been a success and we're keen to be able to keep these opening times going but we don't want our team to burn out.

This is where you come in. Could you help? Would you be able to volunteer some of your time to sit in either the roundhouse or discovery barn, welcoming visitors and sharing the wonders of one of Bourton's hidden Gems with them. 





that the plane was too heavy, as it still had fuel tanks attached to the wings, and that the climb before the dive and loop was too low, making the crash inevitable. He also explained that following a phone call to the Times regarding the crash and the pilot, he caused concern in the aerobatic establishment.

On 12th August we had a highly entertaining talk by Mike Aggleton on the history of limericks, reaching back as far as pre-Norman days. He brought us right up to date with more recent limericks, including WS Gilbert in the Gilbert and Sullivan operettas.lk, which was interactive, encouraging the audience to complete the limericks!


