# Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes



**Coach Parking, pick-up and drop-off:** The Parish Council received emails from the Police, the MP, Gloucestershire County Council Highways and County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson. The police will continue with liaison and enforcement, although they stated that

there was a need to balance this with higher priority crimes and incidents across the district. The MP Sir Geoffrey Clifton-Brown had visited Bourton to see a potential solution and was willing to arrange another meeting. GCC Highways are keen to continue discussions on the use of the Rissington Road car park. County Cllr Hodgkinson received a final report from CDC on the Rissington Road car park and will arrange a meeting with the Parish Council and Bourton Business Network to discuss the report and other related matters.

**Installation of dropped kerbs:** Tourist Levy funded work will go ahead at three locations in November: Outside the Cedars by Box Bush, outside Seasalt and at Clapton Ford outside The Painted House.

**Housing Needs Survey:** Cotswold District Council have given their initial agreement to including Bourton in the 2025 survey in relation to affordable housing. The Gloucestershire Rural Community Council plan to carry out a preliminary 'community snap survey' in March 2025.

**Annual Governance and Accountability Return 2023/24:** The Council was pleased to receive the external audit report with no recommendations for action. The documents are available to view on our website <u>https://www.bourtononthewater-pc.gov.uk/the-council/agar/</u>

**Grants for 2024-25:** The Parish Council awarded a total of £9,105 in small grants for organisations providing activities and services for the parish. Organisations benefitting were the Baden-Powell Hall, Bourton Art Uplift, Bourton Rovers Football Club, Bourton & Sherborne Hockey Club, Bourton Vale Cricket Club, Citizens Advice Stroud & Cotswolds, Cotswold Friends, 1<sup>st</sup> Bourton Scouts, Headspace and Home-Start Cotswolds.

**Date of next meeting:** The next Parish Council meeting will be held at 7pm on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2024 in the Windrush Room, The George Moore Community Centre. All residents are welcome to attend.






#### **Message from the Church**

I write this on the day after 'Education Sunday', when the Catholic Church prays for all children, students and teachers as they return to school, university or other academies at the start of a new academic year. But what religious education are they going to get? In so many institutions there is no religious teaching or worship because as a multi-cultural society no one wants to upset different faith groups. So religion is largely ignored except in the church schools run by Anglicans and Catholics.

Does it matter that so many children have no religious teaching? Indeed it does matter very much. And even more so in this modern age when society and politicians question and overturn the basic religious codes that for centuries, and across the world, have created adhesion in society, and a sense of purpose and moral direction in peoples' lives. The resulting vacuum leads to unhappiness, insecurity and depression, especially with teenagers. When all the basic tenets and values of Christianity (and other religions) are swept away society is left with no spiritual compass and no creed. Everything suddenly seems up for debate, even gender. No wonder so many children are experiencing mental health problems. And with all the emotional confusion and lack of religious upbringing, how can they begin to cope when life brings its challenges, as it always does?

Deep down, we are all searching for the answers to life: why do the innocent suffer, why is granny dying, is there life after death, how do I cope with stress, what is the point of marriage? The churches are not full of saints. But a considerable number of people have become Christians because they have learnt that God does indeed exist and that he is the key to everything, even our existence.



Autumn has well and truly arrived – 2 degrees this morning but promise of warm weather again next week so the dahlias may survive a few weeks longer.

Our speaker at the September meeting was Dr. Michael Jones who gave us a really fascinating talk about David Douglas, a Scottish botanist, and one of the less well-known Plant Hunters.

David wanted to be a plant hunter from the age of 19 and at 28 his first journey funded by the Horticultural Society of London took him to New York where he collected seeds from sunflowers, clematis and evening primrose.

His second journey was to Western North America which took 9 months by boat and landed at Cape Disappointment! For his 3 years there he took 2 shirts, a tent, a blanket and a coat. He collected White dogwood, Douglas Fir (named after him), Ribes, Penstemon, Delphinium and many more. There were always problems sending plants back to England and on one occasion the boat sank losing his plants and notes.

On his return from this expedition, he was feted as a hero but after 6 months he became bored so embarked on a third journey. This took him to California and

Hawaii where among his finds were California poppies and Garrya Eliptica.

Sadly, whilst out exploring he fell into a Bull pit and was gored to death at the age of 35 in 1834.

Whilst not well known he introduced to Britain 880 seed species, 200 of which were original and 130 were hardy in Britain.





#### Batsford to Blockley & Moreton in Marsh – Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> October – Moderate 3.5hr 7.5ml

A demanding walk from Batsford Arboretum to Blockley then a gradual descent to Moreton in Marsh and a leisurely stroll back to Batsford Arboretum.

Batsford Arboretum is a glorious place to visit, and lunch can be had after the walk in the grounds or in the café. Batsford Park belonged to the Mitford family and their colourful daughters - we'll enlighten you about the girls! Then on to Blockley where Father Brown is filmed, and the parish church of Saints Peter and Paul is renamed as St. Mary's Roman Catholic church for the programme. Did you see one of our flamingos in Bourton recently? We have unofficially adopted flamingos as our mascot and we hid 20 little flamingo rubber ducks around


the village hoping people would find them and get involved in our "flamingo jail-break."
