# BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER PARISH COUNCIL

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting, 4<sup>th</sup> December 2024

**County Councillor Paul Hodkinson** recently chaired a meeting between residents of Melville and Springvale, Thames Water, Bromford Housing and other agencies to discuss elevated lead levels in the water supply at some properties. Thames Water is replacing

lead pipework up to the property boundaries for affected homeowners and Bromford Housing is replacing pipework to the properties they own.

A residents' group has been formed for those affected. Grant funding may be available to assist with the costs of remedial works - please contact Cllr Hodgkinson for further information.

**District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale)** reported that Cotswold District Council will increase their Council Tax Support Scheme for 2025-26 for residents on low income, or who claim benefits.

CDC's budget for 2025-26 is expected to include additional expenditure on disabled facilities using grant funding. Gloucestershire Firearms Licensing is not currently accepting new applications for shotgun certificates (excluding for work or elite sports) due to a nationwide staffing problem. The current focus is on renewal of existing licences.

**Coach Parking:** County Cllr Hodgkinson and local stakeholders continue to explore options for a short-term solution on the industrial estate. Investigations into costs for the longer-term solution are still underway at the Cotswold School.

**Cotswold District Council's Tourist Levy Funding 2024-25:** Funds have been transferred to the Parish Council towards additional parking enforcement, a Village Green refresh, the resurfacing project at The Chestnuts and a Village Warden budget, totalling £26,750.

**Clapton Row Green:** The Parish Council used Tourist Levy funds from 2023-24 for the installation of a low hedge around the perimeter together with the removal of large stones which has greatly enhanced the appearance of the Green.

**Housing Needs Survey 2025:** The Parish Council will progress plans with Gloucestershire Rural Community Council to create a survey for circulation later in the year by the district council to assess the requirements for affordable housing in the parish.

**Thames Water** is progressing upgrades to the sewage infrastructure in the parish. The new rising main between the pumping station and treatment works has been installed, with final testing underway. Challenges, including weather delays, have shifted some phases to spring 2025. Key timelines are:

• Sewage Treatment Works: Ongoing until summer 2026 • Pumping Station Upgrade: Autumn 2024–Spring 2026





# **Message from the Church**

## The Epiphany

'And by the light of that same star,

Three Wise Men came from country far,

To seek for a King was their intent,

# And to follow the star wheresoever it went.'

Who were these Wise Men sometimes termed Three Kings?

St Matthew says they came from the East, the Land of Sunrise and termed 'Magoi' in the Greek text. The title is mainly found outside the Bible, sometimes connected to Zoroastrian priests of early religions of Western Iran, who were deep into alchemy, astrology and other form of esoteric knowledge. (The term 'magic' comes from Magus). But there is no suggestion that these men who came to the manger were anything other than genuine scientists, astronomers and philosophers.

They were fascinated by the powerful star, which astronomers confirm as historical fact, and which occurred in 6 BC, when the planets Jupiter and Saturn came very close together, giving off a tremendous light. That date is now agreed by almost all commentators, to be the year of Jesus's birth.

As philosophers, they sought answers to the human predicament. Why are we here? Who and what is God? What is life after death? The Magi's search speaks of the instinctive search for the God, 'without whom our hearts are restless', as St Augustine famously said.

At the manger, their values were turned over. Their lives began all over again, for using the words of TS Eliot in his great poem *The Journey of the Magi: 'We returned to our places, these kingdoms, But no longer at ease here, in the old dispensation'....* The Wise Men found what they had journeyed for, but not what they envisaged. They found a helpless, vulnerable infant, but in that manifestation (or Epiphany) they instinctively recognised God, for whom their souls longed.




Walks are free although we do invite donations to help fund our conservation and improvement work.

#### WASSAIL !!

What do you know about Bourton's community Jubilee Orchard?

It is owned and maintained by the Parish Council and our community volunteer tree warden, on behalf of our community. Jubilee Orchard contains various fruit trees and an abundance of bulbs. Situated near Bourton Vale Car Park on the main footpaths into the village, it is an important part of the green lungs of the village.

A small community event is being planned,



based on the local south west tradition of "Wassail". This toasts the orchard's trees literally, by placing toast among the branches of trees, during a gathering involving performance and song. The toast is soaked in cider (or juice) made from the apples harvested in August this year. The orchard's trees are "toasted" with the "Wassail!!". This tradition reflects the place of the south west in cider making and is based on respecting, thanking and encouraging the future fertility of the fruit trees.

As importantly, a wassail is the chance for local residents to gather in midwinter, traditionally around twelfth night (around 6th January).


# Irene's Charity Knitting Circle


